Special Town Meeting November 25th

During their October 21st meeting, the Select Board called a Special Town Meeting that will be hosted at 6pm on November 25th at Acton Boxborough Regional High School. While the warrant is continuing to take shape, the warrant will include consideration of a land purchase at 19 and 35 Wetherbee Street.; acceptance of a LAND grant to help cover the cost of the purchase; authorization to borrow for a new Ambulance; and approval of two collective bargaining agreements. Recent grant awards for the Town

In addition to the \$500,000 LAND grant awarded to the Town for the Wetherbee property purchase, the Town was recently awarded two Community Compact grants totalling \$90,000 that will fund an equity audit and be spearheaded by the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion office; and \$40,000 for a community health assessment, spearheaded by the Health and Human Services Department. The Town also received \$126,750 from the Dam and Seawall Program to help fund the removal of Bellows Farm Mill Dam and restoration of Nashoba Brook. I am proud of the continued efforts of Town staff in obtaining alternative funding to undertake projects that would not have been possible without these grants.

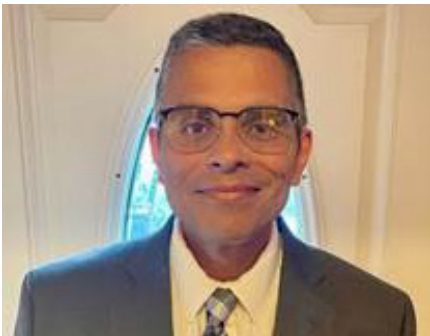
NATE RYAN, ASSISTANT TOWN PLANNER
