
TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

As we enter into the final weeks of summer, many of you and your families are preparing for the first days of school and fall schedules. Please consider visiting a local business for your back to school supply shopping and fall preparation. There have been a number of new, exciting businesses opening in town and excellent existing local businesses who are ready to help in your preparation.

If you are looking for some late summer activities to attend, the Recreation Department concert series continues through August with a variety of groups. The concert series culminates in Taylorville, a Taylor Swift tribute concert scheduled for August 22nd from 7-9:30pm. Tickets are on sale now through the Recreation Department. Additionally, the Recreation and Economic Development Departments have partnered to create a voucher program to be used towards a concert ticket. Next Phases of the Kelley's Corner Project

As work continues in the Kelley's Corner corridor, a portion of the work will transition overnight in an effort to ensure roads and sidewalks are completed before school restarts. On Thursday August 14th and Friday August 15th, MassDOT contractor MIG will conduct paving operations. During this time, there will be detours to allow work to commence. Changes to Acton Power Choice

Recent impacts to the electricity supply market have resulted in unexpected impacts to rates. As part of these changes, the Acton Power Choice program will be adjusting the amount of additional electricity supplied from new renewable energy sources. Currently, this program utilizes 45% electricity from new renewable energy sources. In an effort to maintain the current rate of the APC program, the Select Board voted to reduce the percentage of additional electricity supplied by these renewable sources to 23%. While this change is not ideal, it ensures rates do not increase and the program continues to utilize renewable energy sources. Dedication of Clement and Elizabeth H. Moritz Forest Conservation Land

During the November 2024 Special Town Meeting, attendees approved the land purchase of 19 and 35 Wetherbee Street, which was paid in part through a LAND grant from the State. For the better part of 8 months, the Conservation Division and Planning Division worked together to complete the purchase and develop trails throughout the site. On July 23rd, I was happy to attend the ribbon cutting and dedication of this land as the Clement and Elizabeth H. Moritz Forest Conservation Land. The Moritz Forest, a 33 acre historic forest, provides walking trails and a combination of wooded and open space abutting the Wetherbee Conservation Land. Between the two properties, the Town has protected 100+ acres of wetlands and forests for residents and future visitors to enjoy.






HISTORY OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES IN MASSACHUSETTS

Throughout the month of August, we celebrate three important days—International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples, International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and Its Abolition, and Women's Equality Day.

August 9: International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples highlights Indigenous Peoples all across the globe. This day commemorates the first meeting of the UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations of the Sub-Commission on the Promotion and Protection of Human Rights in 1982. While, as Americans, we often focus on the atrocities inflicted on the Indigenous Peoples in our own country's history, all over the globe, indigenous people have been victims of violent colonialism and are still being hurt by it today. Many governments and big businesses often ignore the rights of Indigenous Peoples to fulfill their agendas. For example, many indigenous children are taken from their homes and forced into boarding schools to adopt colonial ideals through violence, and nations on six different continents are in danger of losing land due to corporate greed. Indigenous groups make up the majority of cultural diversity in the world, estimated to speak 7,000 languages and represent 5,000 cultures. Despite their differences, all Indigenous Peoples face the same struggles related to the protection of their rights, poverty, marginalization, and many human rights violations. We take this day to celebrate their culture and educate on their history and how we can help protect their rights.

August 23: International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and Its

Abolition is meant to bring awareness to the horrors many enslaved Africans faced through Europe and North America's slave trade. The day marks the beginning of the slave uprising in Haiti that would be the start of North America's journey towards abolition. Many Africans were ripped from their homes in Africa and forced onto a horrific journey across the Atlantic known as the Middle Passage. Olaudah Equiano writes about his experiences in his book *The Interesting Narrative of the Life of Olaudah Equiano, or Gustavus Vassa, the African*. He was an important figure in ending slavery in the UK. In the US, Harriet Tubman helped lead a series of journeys from Maryland to Canada to free about 70 enslaved Africans through the Underground Railroad, giving her the title "The Moses of her People". Frederick Douglass was also a prominent figure who toured North America and Europe to spread the ideas of the Abolitionist Movement.

August 26: Women's Equality Day is celebrate

commemorating the day the Nineteenth Amendment was ratified in 1920. The Amendment prevented states from withholding the right to vote based on sex, but many people of color were suppressed from voting through poll taxes or literacy tests, including women of color. Many women of color had to continue this fight for suffrage after white women got their ability. It wasn't until 1965 when the Voting Rights Act was passed that banned these suppression laws and women of all backgrounds could vote in elections. Ida B. Wells-Barnett was born a slave and became a journalist to write about the conditions for African-Americans in the South in the late 19th/early 20th centuries. Fannie Lou Hamer was another woman who fought for the Voting Rights Act of 1965. She co-founded the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party, National Women's Political Caucus, and founded the Freedom Farm Collective. On this day, it is important to recognize the struggles of women around us and support ALL women, no matter who they are.






