TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

I am thankful to all of our employees and departments for their dedication and commitment to providing services which are responsive to residents needs. TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

Many Acton families will have access to SNAP benefits interrupted this month due to the federal government shutdown. Below is a photo of progress on the historic rehabilitation of the 17 Woodbury property. This photo at right shows how the original framing was preserved and new framing was added to create unique interior space. Stay tuned for more photos next month when the project will be completed.



MassDOT continues to make progress on the Kelley's Corner Infrastructure project. They will finish sidewalks and curbing soon, and the planting of the trees and vegetation will occur in the spring. The pedestrian street lighting is scheduled to be installed this winter. Final paving will be in the spring and the pavement markings will reflect the bike lanes, medians, and other traffic calming measures in the plan. The new intersection does not have a left turn lane for traffic heading southbound on Main Street. The new traffic pattern will require drivers traveling south on Main Street to take a left on Carroll Spinney Way if they want to go east on Mass Ave.

The Select Board voted in October to move forward with a new design concept for the DPW Facility project. The major change is that this new design will reuse the existing DPW building for vehicle storage instead of building a new vehicle storage garage. This will reduce the cost of the project and prevent the need to relocate operations during construction. More information may be found at www.actonma.gov/dpwfacility

Did you know that the initial part of the DPW Facility project is to relocate the DPW fueling station? At 2024 Annual Town Meeting, voters approved funding to construct a new and relocated fuel depot on the DPW facility site. This project is nearly completed. The existing fuel station is not adequate for safety reasons and is located in the middle of DPW driveway. The new facility will have all of the latest safety features and its new location will allow for more efficient use of space on the site. Stay tuned for photos of the new facility next month!

Under the guidance of experienced and certified officers, recruits apply classroom knowledge in real world scenarios while being evaluated on performance, decision making, and adherence to department policies. Recruit officers typically complete the program in 12 weeks before working on their own.

NOVEMBER: A MONTH TO HONOR, REMEMBER, AND CELEBRATE

November is full of important observances that shine a light on history, culture, and community: Native and Indigenous American Heritage Month, Veterans Day, Transgender Awareness Week, Dia de los Muertos, and Red Shawl Day. November invites us to reflect, learn, and stand in solidarity with communities that have shaped our history and continue to strengthen our future.

NATIVE AND INDIGENOUS AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

This month celebrates the history, culture, and contributions of Native American and Alaskan Native communities. From art and weaving to rituals and spiritual traditions, these practices continue to shape our nation. About 2% of Americans identify as Native or Indigenous. You can get involved by learning their history, supporting environmental stewardship, or celebrating cultural traditions like “rocking your mocs,” traditional Indigenous footwear.

DIA DE LOS MUERTOS (NOV. 1-2)

Dia de los Muertos, or Day of the Dead, honors loved ones who have passed. Rooted in Aztec traditions and Catholicism, families build altars (ofrendas) and offer gifts to the deceased. La Catrina, a striking skeleton figure, reminds us to embrace our true selves. Celebrations often include colorful costumes, music, and community gatherings.

VETERANS DAY (NOV. 11)

Veterans Day honors all who have served in the U.S. military. Poppies, inspired by the poem In Flanders Fields, remain a symbol of remembrance. This day is a chance to thank veterans, while remembering the challenges many face after service, including mental health struggles and homelessness.

TRANSGENDER AWARENESS WEEK (NOV. 13-19)

This week raises awareness of transgender experiences and coincides with Transgender Day of Remembrance, honoring those lost to anti-transgender violence. It's a time to listen, learn, and support transgender individuals by challenging harmful stereotypes and uplifting diverse voices.

RED SHAWL DAY (NOV. 19)

Red Shawl Day honors missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls, and two-spirit people. Indigenous women face disproportionately high rates of violence, and wearing red symbolizes remembrance, resilience, and advocacy.



The community is invited to explore the power of allyship and respect for all at a free screening of *Shared Legacies*, a moving documentary about important historical lessons of the Black Jewish Alliance during the Civil Rights Movement.


PICKLEBALL AND TENNIS SIGN-UPS



