

TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

After being closed for over a year due to the pandemic, we're excited to announce all town buildings are re-open to the public, effective May 3rd. Town staff has worked collaboratively over the past several months to implement various protocols designed to protect the health and safety of employees and the community. As you enter many of these buildings you will notice several enhancements, such as signage, touchless hand sanitizers, floor markings to encourage social distancing, and much more. We will continue to closely monitor new guidance and information to ensure your safety. Additional information related to the reopening may be found by visiting actonma.gov/COVID19.

The Annual Town Meeting will be held at 6:00 PM on Monday, June 21st at the Acton-Boxborough Regional High School. Attendees will have the option to sit either inside or outside. All materials including the Town Meeting warrant will be published within the next several weeks and may be found by visiting actonma.gov/townmeeting. The last day to register to vote in the Annual Town Meeting is Tuesday, June 1st. Contact the Town Clerk's office for an application, or register online at RegisterToVoteMA.com.

At the Annual Town Election held in March, Acton voters approved the second step required by law to change the name of the Board of Selectmen to Select Board. Town staff has begun the process of converting all materials to reflect the name change.

A friendly reminder that the Select Board has scheduled a Special Town Election on Tuesday, June 29th, at the RJ Grey Junior High School from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM to fill the remainder of Joan Gardner's term on the Select Board.

We are excited to announce Acton has received \$7,500 from the Americans with Disabilities Act Improvement Program through the Massachusetts Office on Disability. This grant will fund a long-time priority of Acton's Commission on Disabilities to increase the availability of adaptive bicycles within the community. The Recreation Department will utilize this funding to acquire three adaptive bicycles (for all ages) and associated safety accessories. The bicycles will be stored at NARA Park and provided for use by the community within the park or on the Rail Trails. Thanks to the efforts of Recreation Director Melissa Rier and Commission on Disabilities member Leslie Johnson for their work on this exciting new initiative.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Natural Resources is collaborating with staff from Zoo New England to improve nesting habitat for wood turtles on the sunny embankment behind the bleachers at Veterans' Field. The turtles emerge from Nashoba Brook in the spring and spend the summer foraging on land. Females nest in early June. Zoo New England installed radio tracking on four female turtles. Once laid, eggs are taken offsite for incubation. Hatchlings are given a "head-start" indoors for a year; then returned to the brook, larger and stronger. On April 26 volunteers and staff removed turf and invasive plants to make the ground easier for female turtles to dig their nests.

ARBOR DAY WELCOMES A NEW TREE AND OUR FIRST IN-PERSON GATHERING!

The Town of Acton hosted a multi-departmental celebration of Arbor Day and Earth Day at Jones Field. Blustery cold weather did not stop community members and our beloved K9 Zane from planting and welcoming the new red maple to the field in need of shade trees. Tree Warden Ryan Hunt led town staff and residents during the planting ceremony and Town librarians read a story for children, complete with Yoga tree poses.

Acton has a long tradition of tree care and conservation efforts—for 24 years it has been a Tree City USA, an honor granted by the Arbor Day Foundation for commitment to urban forestry, community improvement, and civic pride. Last year the Town received a Tree City Growth Award, which is given to select communities that demonstrate higher levels of tree care and community engagement. The new red maple also advances the Acton Open Space and Recreation plan shade tree planting program, a tree-planting program that has been running since 1941. Over 2,000 trees have been planted or set back from the road edge under this program. We look forward to continuing the decades long tradition and seeing more of you next year!

This process will involve grinding, adjusting drainage structures and putting down a final course of pavement.



COMMUNITY SERVICES

HOME MODIFICATION LOAN PROGRAM

The Home Modification Loan Program (HMLP) provides 0% interest loans up to \$50,000.00, or \$30,000 for mobile homes, to modify homes of elders and individuals with disabilities. Payments are deferred until the transfer of the property.

The mission is to enable a person with a disability to continue to live in his/her home, be as independent as possible and continue to play an active role in his/her community.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Loans are available to individual homeowners with incomes of up to 200% of median income. The program is not based on credit worthiness. With a 0% deferred payment loan, there are no monthly payments and no added monthly financial burden.

NEW CHILDCARE SUBSIDY FOR INCOME-ELIGIBLE LOCAL FAMILIES

The Towns of Acton, Boxborough, Littleton, Maynard and Westford have been awarded funds from the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development through a regional CARESACT Community Development Block Grant Program to provide COVID-specific relief to local communities.

Childcare Subsidies are available for low to moderate-income families in all five towns. Participating families will receive \$3,000 for children preschool aged or younger and \$2,000 for children in Kindergarten to age 13 towards their daycare or after school costs so that parents and guardians may work, go to school or seek employment. Funds will be allocated to income qualified families on a first come, first serve basis by each Town using the income limits below with a maximum award during the grant year not to exceed \$5,000 per child. FIRE SAFETY FOR GASOLINE AND LAWN MOWERS

Gasoline and Lawn Mowers Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and can ignite if you light a match or cigarette.

Store gasoline only in approved containers, outside, or in a building not attached to the house. Never keep gasoline inside the home.

Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, campfires, and grills.

Never fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Let it cool off first.

Keep hands and feet away from a mower while it is running.



NATURAL RESOURCES

Archaeological consultants Gray and Pape conducted an investigation of the Shoddy Wool Mill site at 53 River Street in April. Found objects include old shoddy wool material, buttons, machinery parts, and char from the fire that destroyed the mill in 1951. After the results of the archaeological study are reviewed by the Acton and Massachusetts Historical Commissions, planning will commence for the design of an historic park. Plans for the removal of the dam will also be revised and permitting of the project through state, federal and local regulatory authorities will continue.

GREEN GRASS AND CLEAR WATER

Many of us value having nice lawns and enjoy the time we spend working on them. However, some lawn care practices can create water quality problems. Plants need nutrients to grow, but excess nutrients, including the nitrogen and phosphorus found in fertilizers, can run off our properties when it rains and cause problems in local waterbodies. Too many nutrients in our water can trigger algal blooms that cloud water and rob it of oxygen.



Here are some easy practices for creating and maintaining a truly healthy lawn that looks great and is safer for the environment!

- Test your soil! Only apply fertilizer when necessary.
- Apply fertilizer sparingly and ensure proper fertilizer application rates.
- Apply fertilizers in the spring and early fall when grass is vigorously growing.
- Select fertilizers with low or no phosphorus unless a soil test indicates otherwise.
- Apply organic fertilizers if possible.
- Choose slow release fertilizers when possible.
- Try not to apply fertilizers near waterbodies.
- Don't overwater. Typically, 1" of water per week applied over 1 or 2 days is enough.
- Mow grass no shorter than 3" high.
- Cut grass often enough so you never remove more than 1/3 of the blade at a time.
- Leave the clippings after mowing so they can return nutrients to the soil.

Using these water-quality friendly lawn care and fertilizer recommendations is a small change that can make a big difference. For further information, please contact the Acton Land Use Department.
