The North Acton Fire Station ribbon cutting ceremony was held on Friday, June 10th and was well-attended by state and local officials and the Acton community. This state-of-the-art facility was delivered on-time and on budget and will serve as a model for future public safety facilities, particularly for its innovations in environmental sustainability. Thank you to the Select Board, Finance Committee, Building Committee, and voters for your support of this project. About the Award

Each year town employees are invited to nominate their co-workers for the “Joseph A. Lalli Merit Award”, generously supported and funded by the Steinberg-Lalli Charitable Foundation.

Mr. Joseph Lalli was a strong supporter of public service and wished to leave a legacy by acknowledging a public safety employee and municipal employee each year for their outstanding performance and their extraordinary contributions made to the town and the various programs and services provided to our citizens.

History of Mr. Lalli

Mr. Joseph A. Lalli was born and raised on a small farm in Maynard to Italian immigrant parents. His father worked in the woolen mills in Maynard as did Joe in his youth. At the time, Maynard was a melting pot of immigrants from many different countries. People of that area derived their livelihood almost entirely from the mills, and the other small businesses that served the workers and their families.

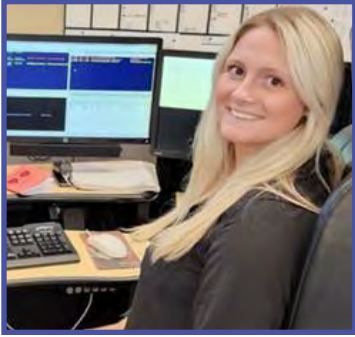
A survivor of rheumatic fever – the disease scarred Joe’s heart and he was forced to find a less strenuous occupation than millwork. He graduated from Fitchburg State College and spent a good part of his working life as an educator in New England. Joe worked diligently at other ventures: growing vegetables, running a bowling alley, starting a driving school, and selling postage stamps to collectors. He lived frugally and invested wisely in the stock market, in cultivating blueberries, in oil and gas partnerships and real estate. Mr. Lalli was very successful.

Many years ago, Mr. Lalli and another local businessman became partners in various ventures, including some here in Acton. A charitable foundation was formed by these two individuals to do good works and share their success with other worthy individuals.

Melissa Rier, Recreation Director

Melissa (shown in photo above) received her Bachelor’s Degree from Bridgewater State University in Communications, and her Master’s Degree from Springfield College in Recreation Management. Melissa has been with the Acton Recreation Department since her hire in Spring 2011. Her experience working with children of all ages in the educational and recreational fields spans over 18 years. Melissa has many accomplishments she has achieved since joining the Town. Certifications include obtaining the distinguished Certified Parks and Recreation Professional (CPRP), She has become a Red Cross CPR, first aid and AED Instructor, Red Cross Lifeguard Instructor and most recently, became a Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI). Melissa is also certified by the state to teach infants, toddlers and preschool aged children.

Melissa oversaw the renovation/rebuild of three playgrounds including Goward, Jones Field, and currently the final stages of Gardner Field. She has also been in charge of NARA Summer Camp and NARA Beach and instrumental in the completion of the T.J. O’Grady Memorial Skate Park. Melissa worked diligently to work with committees helping to make Acton playground renovations come to fruition. Melissa in addition to daily Recreation Department operations, works on CPA projects, and helped create the 10-year NARA Master Plan (2016-2026), and is currently working on the 7-year Open Space and Recreation Plan.
