TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

Preparation of the Fiscal Year 2024 Recommended Budget and Capital Plan is well underway. Departments have submitted their budget requests adhering to the following objectives:

- Consider reorganizations to improve coordination on priority programs and services.
- Consider customer service needs and ways to leverage technology to enhance services to our community.
- Target investments that align with Select Board goals.
- Target investments that advance recommendations and initiatives from the Climate Action Plan
- Identify programs that advance efforts to address concerns related to equity and mental health.

On December 5th, the FY2024-2033 Capital Improvement Plan will be presented to the Select Board and Finance Committee. The Town Manager's Recommended Budget will be presented to the Select Board on December 19th.

On January 10, 2022, the Select Board approved the creation of the Department of Public Works Facility Study Committee (DPWFSC) to evaluate options for the reconstruction or renovation of the DPW facilities located at 14 Forest Road including the Transfer Station. After more than a year of work to evaluate the feasibility, planning, design, service levels, and financial estimates for the design and construction of a DPW Facility building project, the committee is presenting its [report](#) on November 7, 2022 to the Select Board.

I am proud to announce that the Town recently received two grants to support housing needs through the Baker-Polito Administration's Community One Stop for Growth program. The Town has received a \$2.3 million grant from the MassWorks Infrastructure Grant Program to support the construction of a sewer extension for the Acton Housing Authority's affordable senior housing project on Main Street. This will encompass infrastructure work to prepare for the housing, including utility extensions, drainage, and stormwater collection sites, retaining walls, hydrants, and sidewalks.

We also received \$63,600 from the Housing Choice Grant Program to conduct phase two of the [South Acton Vision and Action Plan and 3A Zoning project](#), which will help develop zoning recommendations to advance the community vision established in phase 1 and meet state requirements. The process will result in a new plan for South Acton and zoning changes that will be brought to Town Meeting.

WINTER PARKING BAN

Residents are reminded that a winter parking ban is in effect from November 1 until April 1. On-street parking is not allowed between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. The parking ban also includes the Municipal Parking areas located behind the W. Acton Fire Station (258 Central St), S. Acton Fire Station (54 School Street), Railroad Street, rail trail terminus at Maple Street, and at the end of Sylvia Street. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.



WINTER MAINTENANCE

Please remember that our crews have to travel on snow covered, slippery untreated roads to get here at any hour of the day or night. Please be patient as the crews will be out as soon as possible to begin the snow & ice operations. We are currently experiencing a shortage of plow contractors so our snow & ice operations for sidewalks and roads will take longer than usual. We ask for your patience and understanding.

FIRE HYDRANTS

Fire hydrants are under the control of the Acton Water District. The Water District asks residents with hydrants in front of or near their property to please clear the snow away from the area so that in an emergency the hydrant will be accessible. Questions regarding snow removal near hydrants should be directed to the [Acton Water District](#) at (978) 263-9107.

MAILBOXES AND BASKETBALL POSTS & NETS

Mailboxes installed in the Town right of way are placed at the owner's risk. Each mailbox installation should be sufficiently solid to withstand snow-clearing efforts by the Town. It is the responsibility of the owner of the mailbox to clear the snow around the mailbox to assure mail delivery by the U.S. Postal Service, not the DPW or its plow contractors. If the snow banks are too high to shovel, place a temporary box beside the road until

the snow has melted enough to allow access to the mailbox. Please check that your mailbox and post are secure and in good condition prior to the snow season. When installing a mailbox choose a suitable location. If you are unsure, check with the postal carrier.



Please remove your basketball posts & nets away from the edge of the road before the snow & ice events. These can cause damage to Town vehicles and also interferes with snow removal operations. The Town cannot be held responsible for damage caused to them.

SAND AND SALT

A mixture of sand and salt is available to residents (no contractors) at the designated area located at the Highway Division, 14 Forest Road. Please use caution while entering and exiting as vehicles and equipment are prevalent. Please bring your own shovel and container.






